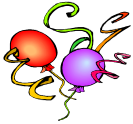

**MESSAGE FROM FR. BRADLEY MILLER**

**“... Ask and it will be given you...”**

**Luke 11:9**

**I**mpressed by something about the way Jesus prayed, one of His disciples said to Him, “Lord teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples”. Our Lord then gave them a model prayer which would become a standard prayer known as the Lord’s prayer”.

Continuing with the subject of prayer, the Lord gave an illustration designed to show God’s willingness to hear and answer our petitions. The story has to do with a man who had a guest arrive at this home at midnight. Unfortunately he did not have anything to offer him, so he went to a neighbor, knocked on his door and said, “Friend, lend me three loaves of bread, for a friend of mine has arrived and I have nothing to set before him”.

At first the neighbor was annoyed, He said, “Do not bother me, the door has already been locked, and my children are with me in bed, I cannot get up and give you anything”. Yet, because of his persistence the man got up and gave Him what he needed.

In applying this illustration to our own lives, we must be careful to avoid certain conclusions. It does not mean that God is annoyed by our persistent prayer. It does not mean that the only way to get our prayer answered is to be persistent. What this illustration teaches us is that everyone who asks receives. This is a promise that when we pray God always gives us something better. A “no” answer might mean that He knows what is best for us, and so His denial is better than our petition.

This illustration also teaches us that we must never grow weary or discouraged in our prayer life, but we must keep on asking, keep on seeking, and keep on knocking.

**ANGLICAN DIOCESE MAKES ANOTHER  
DONATION TO HAITI RELIEF**

The Anglican Diocese of The Bahamas and The Turks and Caicos Islands has made its third donation to the Anglican Church in Haiti for its relief effort, this one in the amount of \$40,000.00 (forty thousand dollars). This brings the total given thus far to \$73,300.00 (seventy-three thousand three hundred dollars).

The Episcopal Diocese of Haiti has numerous camps around the city of Port-au-Prince where persons from all walks of life can live, eat, congregate and receive medical and other help. Our diocesan donation will go toward the feeding programme in these camps, and towards general relief efforts.

The Rt. Rev’d. Laish Boyd, Diocesan Bishop, along with Dean Patrick Adderley, Archdeacons Keith Cartwright and James Palacious, visited Haiti on 6<sup>th</sup> March, 2010, to establish official ties with the Diocese of Haiti and to spend a day with the Bishop of Haiti, The Rt. Rev’d. Jean Zache Duracin.
